Bridge may improve your health.

Research on the impact of learning Bridge on elementary students has proved that the kids who played had an [astounding increase in their test scores](#) compared with their non-playing classmates. Bridge dramatically helps the development of **inferential thinking**, which leads to better performances in all subject areas, not just maths and science.

Research on Bridge players and nonplayers aged 55-91 indicated that players outperformed nonplayers in measures of **working memory** and **reasoning**.

A study published in 2003 proved that senior citizens who play a board game have 74% **lower risk of dementia**.

Playing Bridge [stimulates the thymus gland](#), which produces white blood cells (T lymphocytes), thus enhancing the **immune system**.

Listening, etiquette, concentration, dealing with winning and losing and many other social skills can be enhanced by playing Bridge. It develops your mental abilities and helps the brain to stay young and healthy.



Benito Garozzo number 2 in the World overall ranking, with 10 world titles, is 90 years old. He still plays at the top level: in 2013 he won a silver medal at the European Open Championships.
